From the Director's Desk

Held annually in more than 600 communities nationwide, the Alzheimer's Association Walk to End Alzheimer's is the world's largest fundraiser for Alzheimer's care, support and research. This inspiring event calls on participants of all ages and abilities to join the fight against the disease.

The Lackawanna County Area Agency on Aging along with other community organizations and families who have been touched by Alzheimer's Disease, will walk together on October 19, 2024, registration begins at 9:00 am, at PNC Field. We hope you can join us!

Lackawanna County is also taking steps to be recognized as a Dementia Friendly Community! Our collaborative partnerships allow us to work together to raise awareness, increase knowledge, reduce stigma and engage community members in transforming Pennsylvania into an inclusive place for persons living with dementia.

When caring for some with Alzheimer's, often people don't know where to turn for help and may feel isolated and alone. There are programs and resources in our community that can support caregivers, that are unknown to the general public. If you are reading this, I hope raising awareness about local resources helps you.

Programs and Support

- Call the Alzheimer's Association 24/7 Helpline **(800.272.3900)** anytime to receive reliable information, advice and support. 24/7 Helpline free and confidential. Dial 711 to connect with a TRS operator
- Call the Lackawanna County Area Agency on Aging **(570.963.6740)** and ask about The Pennsylvania Caregiver Support Program (CSP). CSP is a program that supports caregivers in the state with information, training, counseling and financial reimbursement for certain out-of-pocket expenses related to their caregiving duties
- Call the United Way of Lackawanna, Wayne, & Pike Counties (570.343.1267) and ask about the Volunteer Navigators who help Caregivers (and Care Receivers) connect to resources in our community.
- Call Telespond Senior Services (570.346.7860) Telespond offers caregivers respite
 programs from the demanding responsibilities of caregiving. Telespond Senior
 Services operates extended hours five days a week to allow caregivers and family
 members to pursue normal work and school schedules. Our extended hours which
 also include programs on Saturday throughout the year, designate Telespond Senior
 Services as an enhanced medical model.
- Call The Wright Center for Community Health (570.230.0019) to learn about their Alzheimer's and Dementia Care Program. It offers a range of health and supportive services to improve the quality of life of individuals with dementia and their caregivers.





Signs of Elder Abuse

Elder abuse is an intentional act or failure to act that causes or creates a risk of harm to an older adult. Common types of elder mistreatment include physical, sexual, emotional/psychological, or financial abuse, neglect, or self-neglect. Elder abuse impacts people of all ages, dentities, and backgrounds.

What are the signs of mistreatment?
